## Welcoming New Members

Our monthly **Newcomers Coffee Mornings** continue to provide an informal setting for recent arrivals to learn more about Brits Abroad. The welcome is warm and, by the end of the morning of friendly chat and tips, our new members are often whisked away for an impromptu visit to the market or a taster session of Mayl.....and so their Shanghai adventure begins.....

Towards the end of 2014, we launched the **Brits Buddies** scheme as another route to help new arrivals have a smooth transition to life in Shanghai. The goal is to link existing Brits members with new members to help show them the ropes. We are building a database of Buddy volunteers, so that we can match newcomers with someone in their neighbourhood with similar family circumstances and interests. Look out for more information and opportunities to get involved during 2015. Brits Buddies is replacing the former Meeters & Greeters programme and the Meeters & Greeters events will now be incorporated into the Social calendar.

Once again, the centrepiece of our social programme was the **Red, White & Blue Ball** – this year held in June to coincide with the FIFA World Cup in Brazil. Nearly 200 guests enjoyed the fantastic food and entertainment in the elegant Ballroom setting of the Waldorf Astoria on the Bund.

Our chosen charity was Operation Smile and one of our Ball guests summed it up beautifully saying, “What more could anyone have hoped for than to see so many smiling faces at the Ball and to know we raised enough money to create so many more.”



A few days later, we donned our finery again to celebrate **Ascot Ladies Day** with lunch at Tavola. The horse-themed raffle supported Operation Smile and there was much debate over which outfits, hats and fascinators deserved a special prize.

Once again, our guests were incredibly generous in their support of Stepping Stones and Heart to Heart.

Preparations are well underway for our 2015 **Valentine's Lunch** at El Willy's and we're looking forward to a fabulous red-themed afternoon in aid of Heart to Heart.

Throughout the year, we have held several sell-out **Quiz Nights** at The Park Tavern, culminating in a charity quiz in November to benefit The Mercy Fund. The 'lucky' winners of each event have been invited to set the questions for the following quiz and have risen to the challenge with fiendish questions that have perplexed us all.



A lovely new tradition is the **Welcome Back Afternoon Tea**. This year, we gathered at Isola in September to catch up with all those folks who had escaped the Shanghai summer. We repeated this in January with a cosy catch up at Kafer in Pudong.



**Drop in Drinks** continues to be a popular monthly fixture to unwind from work and sample a variety of bars across Shanghai. We also gathered for **Sunsetters** at the Southern Belle and had an opportunity to socialise if we were 'home alone' whilst our partners travelled for work or family visits.

Members' creative talents have been in evidence at painting, Chinese knotting and Thai cooking classes. We partnered with Britcham to learn about Traditional Chinese Medicine and John McKenna whetted our appetites for travel in China. The night cycle rides and sidecar tour helped us see Shanghai from a whole new angle.

## Regular Monthly Activities

The beautiful setting of the Salon de Ville in the Waldorf Astoria is a great place to start each month at **Elevenes with Brits**. This year, we've adjusted the layout to accommodate more vendor tables which adds interest for members, increases our Brits Abroad funds and benefits our raffle prize stock. We've been delighted to host performances from the International Women's Choir and also welcomed our charity partners for gift donations. Attendance continues to be strong and the Waldorf coffee morning is certainly a popular venue for membership sign up/renewal and ticket sales for upcoming events.



Just across the river, Paulaner Lujiazui is a more contemporary setting for **Breakfast with Brits**, usually on the third Thursday of the month. We tuck into a delicious breakfast of scrambled eggs, cold meats, cheeses, breads, croissants, jams and honey. All washed down with tea or coffee and accompanied by a good chat with some fun people. Numbers have fluctuated over the year but, at just RMB 65 for Brits Abroad members, it's one of the best value breakfasts in Shanghai – you don't want to miss it!

Brits Abroad **Walks** continued monthly in 2014, except for the usual break for heat in July and August. Our groups, mostly between 15 and 25 members, enjoyed two hours of walking exercise and the opportunity to chat and meet people, with some people heading for an impromptu lunch afterwards with old and new acquaintances. We explored historic areas and buildings, alleys, parks and riverside walks and viewed art, architecture and seasonal decorations in areas of Shanghai that included Hongqiao, Hongkou, Suzhou Creek, Pudong, the Bund and the Old Town.



# Regular Monthly Activities continued

The Walks Team helped coordinate the October **I-Spy Shanghai** event in the former French Concession – a Quiz/Treasure Hunt coupled with food at Cotton’s and charity fundraising for The Renewal Center. Three walks that had to be rescheduled because of rain were also repeated later in the year. The Walks Team welcomes anyone interested in joining its ranks for a fun and stimulating way to discover Shanghai while contributing to local causes and our expat community.



This year's reading list for the **Book Club** has focused on books that are inspirational in nature. The discussions have been equally thought-provoking, with members coming from a variety of backgrounds. We continue to meet in members’ homes, usually on the third Tuesday of the month, and we can guarantee a warm welcome and an interesting discussion. Why not come along and try something new – what better way to read books you might not normally choose!

# Regular Weekly Activities

The **Mahjong** group meets every Monday afternoon at The Park Tavern. This is a very popular activity and we are pleased to see that our numbers are increasing this year. Players of all levels and experience are welcome and we always have a beginners’ table for members who are completely new to the game.

The mahjong tiles are replaced by playing cards on a Wednesday afternoon when the **May1** group meets at The Park Tavern. This card game is based on Rummy but played with two packs of cards over 12 rounds to find the eventual winner. We have been delighted to welcome new members to the group this year and beginners are able to pick up the rules very quickly – it’s a great way to relax, chat and meet new friends.



Every Monday morning a small group of Brits Abroad members meet up in Lujiazui to practise our **Mandarin Conversation** skills whilst chatting informally about everyday topics. Our group is directed by a Chinese Mandarin Teacher who focuses on pronunciation, grammar structure and vocabulary. This is a great way to reinforce the Mandarin language skills we learn during our other Chinese classes. Why not sign up and join us for a taster session?

## Community Outreach

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our Brits Abroad members and supporters, we have been able to support a significant number of Community Outreach projects this year. The money comes from three main sources: targeted fundraising at one-off events, surplus cash from regular events (mahjong, walks etc) and periodic distribution of surplus funds from running Brits Abroad.

The biggest beneficiary this year has been **Operation Smile**, a charity which performs cleft lip and palate surgeries for underprivileged children in China. Following the fundraising efforts at our Red, White & Blue Ball and the Ascot Ladies Day Lunch in June, we donated RMB 140,000 to Operation Smile – enough to fund 28 life-changing surgeries. In November, a small group of Brits Abroad members attended an Operation Smile surgical mission in Nanjing and we were humbled to meet the families and see how this surgery can completely transform a young life.



**Nanjing Butterfly Home** is a children's hospice which opened its doors in the Autumn of 2013. Brits Abroad made an initial donation of RMB 3,000 early in 2014 and we have been kept up to date ever since by the hospice's staff. In November, we visited and saw first hand the warm and loving environment that has been created for these desperately sick children. We have now allocated a further RMB 36,000 for the Nanjing Butterfly Home and this will fully fund one cot for the next year.



## Community Outreach continued

For many years, Brits Abroad has been a staunch supporter of **Heart to Heart** a charity which provides life-saving heart surgery for some of China's poorest children. We have made financial donations following our Valentine's Lunch and also the Junk Your Jiao collection of small change. As part of the allocation of surplus funds, we have recently allocated RMB 25,000 for Heart to Heart which will completely fund the heart surgery for one child.



October is Breast Cancer Awareness month and our 2014 fundraising activities raised RMB 18,000 which has been donated to the **Breast Cancer Unit at Fudan University Hospital** in Shanghai. Women (and some men) travel from across the region for treatment at this specialist unit and our donation will be used to develop and print informative literature to support patients attending the unit.



**Stepping Stones** is an organisation best known for its English language programmes in Shanghai's migrant schools and early in 2014 we donated RMB 10,000 to support their community centre English classes. Our Christmas Lunch raffle (December 2014) was in aid of Stepping Stones' I Care project. This funds eye tests, spectacles and corrective eye surgery for children in migrant schools, where vision defects often go untreated. Our RMB 16,000 donation will be enough to cover three surgeries or provide eye tests/spectacles for over 70 children.



## Community Outreach continued

Tucked away in Pudong are the facilities of **Home Sweet Home** which provides a residential home and training for disabled young adults. This year, we have allocated RMB 14,000 to fund the conversion of some office space into living accommodation, including a bathroom area.

The **Renewal Center** hosts twice-weekly drop-in sessions for Shanghai's homeless adults to take a shower and change their clothes. In addition, the Center runs a smaller residential programme providing a pathway back to employment. Our donation of RMB 12,000 at the beginning of 2014 helped fund a new washing machine and clothes dryer for the centre. We donated a further RMB 3,000 following the I-Spy Shanghai event and that has been earmarked for their women's support project.



Our Autumn Charity Quiz Night featured a raffle in aid of **The Mercy Fund**. This lesser known charity supports children undergoing cancer treatment here in Shanghai. Volunteers visit the children in hospital and the charity also provides financial aid for the poorest families. Our donation of RMB 11,000 will be used for medical treatment bills, benefiting two needy families.



# Community Outreach continued

Last Spring, several of our members visited a migrant school in Minhang district to distribute dental health packs funded by the previous year's Christmas Lunch. This year, we have again allocated funds to the **United Family Hospital Foundation** for their dental health project. Hospital staff volunteer their time to visit underprivileged schools and provide training and dental kits to the staff and students at that location. Our donation of RMB 10,000 will fund dental kits for around 250 students.



**Shanghai Sunrise** provides educational scholarships for children whose families would otherwise be unable to afford high school tuition fees. Over the years, Brits Abroad has sponsored several students through their education. This year, we are supporting two new high school students (total tuition fees RMB 6,000p.a.) and have also set aside a further RMB 5,000 for additional tutoring, should that be required.

Beyond these financial contributions, Brits Abroad members have also been very generous with their non-monetary support this year. We have collected airline/hotel toiletries for Heart to Heart, unwanted winter clothing for The Renewal Center and new children's outfits for Heart to Heart at our 2014 Christmas Lunch. We have also prepared and served a series of British afternoon teas for the homeless men who visit The Renewal Center. In addition to this, many of our members volunteer at several Shanghai charities and gain great personal satisfaction through giving something back to our host community.

# Internal Communications

During 2014, we have reviewed our member communication channels and are introducing several changes. The most exciting of these is a revamp of our Brits Abroad **Website** and we are looking forward to launching this in March 2015.

Website visitors will notice a fresh, up-to-date appearance and technical changes behind the scenes will make website admin much easier for the Brits Abroad team. For the first time, we will be able to manage our weekly email **Bulletin** directly from Shanghai.

We owe a huge THANK YOU to Philip Crispin for the design, development and implementation of our IT solutions – Philip has been a long-term volunteer for Brits Abroad and continues to support us even though he is now based in the UK.

After canvassing our members earlier in the year, we decided to discontinue the quarterly printed **Newsletter** from December 2014. Moving forward, **The Wire** electronic magazine will be published monthly to promote upcoming events and review previous activities, though we still need Editorial volunteers to ensure its continuity. We know that many members enjoy receiving a printed record of their time with Brits Abroad and we are exploring the feasibility of producing a photo yearbook as a lasting memento.





## External Communications

During 2014, we were able to revive our External Communications programme and are now reaping the benefits of wider exposure in the Shanghai community. Our biggest **Public Relations** activity was to attend the September 2014 Expat Show where we gained a good number of new members and useful contacts.

We developed a new flyer to promote Brits Abroad to potential members and sponsors. This has been circulated to schools, relocation companies and local businesses and we continue to expand our contact list.

We have attended events at Dulwich College and YCIS where parents, staff and teachers have seen first-hand what Brits Abroad is all about. We list our regular and featured events on the websites of City Weekend and Time Out and frequently appear in their print editions. City Weekend magazine was particularly supportive of our Red, White & Blue Ball – promoting ticket sales and running a full page photo feature after the event.



**Advertising** revenue helped fund the printing costs of the quarterly Newsletter during 2014. Ongoing, we will assess our options for including paid advertising in The Wire and the updated Brits Abroad website – both have been designed with the capability to display adverts if we decide to follow this route to generate additional income. Our list of **Discount** alliance partners has grown dramatically this year. Brits Abroad members can now receive deals at more than 35 businesses just by showing their membership card. These discounts range from 5% to a whopping 25%.
