Thanks also to the many Brits Abroad members who have helped out at our fundraising events throughout the year.

The generosity of Brits Abroad members and friends has continued throughout 2013-14. Our fundraising events kicked off with the Red, White and Blue Ball in April, which generated much needed funds for the Renewal Center who continue to support homeless men and women in Shanghai. In June, the glamorous ladies at the Ascot Lunch raised money for Heart to Heart's library project; later in the year, some of our members were proud to deliver the books to a rural school in Jiangsu province.

We continue to support two high school students via Shanghai Sunrise and we have said a bittersweet farewell to Amber, who we have sponsored for many years via the Josephine Charles Foundation. Amber has been awarded a full scholarship to continue her studies in Sichuan and progress towards her goal of attending University to study medicine – we wish her well.

We raised a record amount during October's Breast Cancer Awareness events, culminating in our 'touch of pink' lunch at the JW Marriott. As in previous years, our donation will support the work of the Breast Cancer Unit at Fudan University Cancer Hospital. November saw everyone put their thinking caps on for the sell-out Charity Quiz in aid of Huixin Orphanage.

We supported the Dental Health Project of the Yangtze Delta Foundation with our Christmas Lunch raffle, funding oral hygiene kits and training to schoolchildren in the local region. Lunch guests each received a hand-embroidered make-up bag from Home Sweet Home, which provides training and employment for disabled people. The eight children who live at Shining Star (blind orphanage) enjoyed a very special Breakfast with Santa courtesy of Brits Abroad – sometimes we can even make wishes come true!

We have also collected gifts for some of our long-term charities - baby clothes and blankets for Baby's Home Shanghai (Christmas lunch), stationery gifts for migrant children via Stepping Stones (Breakfast with Santa) and, at our February coffee morning, toiletries for Heart to Heart.

Throughout the year, we gather funds for our charity pot from our regular raffles and groups (mahjong, Mayl, walks, book club) and, as the Committee year draws to a close, this is being distributed to several organisations – Stepping Stones, the Renewal Center, Shining Star, the Mercy Fund (child cancer patients), Butterfly Home Nanjing (children's hospice), World Academy for the Future of Women (HIV/AIDS project) and Paw Pals Animal Rescue (animal shelter).
